The other epidemic, and a group of women at risk

Even before measures were put in place to reduce social contact for Covid19, mothers – especially new mothers – were at high risk of mental illness due to social isolation and loneliness. A 2018 UK survey of more than 2,000 mothers found that 90% of them felt lonely after having children and 54% felt "friendless" after giving birth.

Social isolation is a problem for moms, but I think sometimes when moms get together, they are afraid to open up and share their problems. Everyone is afraid of being judged. It doesn't help that many of us have fast-held opinions on the hot button issues: sleep, nutrition, discipline, schooling, and child care options.

It is extremely refreshing to come across another person who is in agreement with us on all these issues. The feeling of relief is followed by a feeling of pure kinship. My mother-in-law hosts a mom's group that I think does a great job in helping people open up and share their opinions. Every month we get together and discuss a topic while she the veteran mom acts as a moderator. In this environment, moms feel like they can open up. The focus is not about finding the best strategy, but on learning from one another, and hearing each other's stories. Or simply convalescing.

Smartphones increasingly impact modern relationships

The share of Americans who own a smartphone increased from 35 percent in 2011 to 81 percent in 2019. Those figures represent a huge increase in couples and families with smartphones in their daily lives. I imagine the increase is similar across many countries, and is an adjustment for couples and families around the globe.

According to recent research by the Pew Research Centre, 51 percent of Americans say that their partner is often or sometimes distracted by their cellphone when they are trying to have a conversation with them. Women are about twice as likely as men to say that they are bothered by the amount of time their partner spends on their cellphone. This suggests that smartphones are indeed having an effect on families.

Passage C: News Report

NZ police seize \$140m from Russian 'computer genius' Alexander Vinnik

Police have frozen \$140 million in bank funds linked to a Russian "computer genius" in the largest ever restraint of funds in New Zealand police history.

The money was controlled by a New Zealand registered company and has been frozen as part of a global investigation into a Bitcoin exchange run by Alexander Vinnik who is alleged to have laundered billions of dollars for criminal syndicates.

In a statement, Police Commissioner Andrew Coster said Vinnik previously operated cryptocurrency exchange BTC-e.

Coster alleged that BTC-e, which operated from the United States, had no anti-money-laundering controls and policies. This resulted in criminals and cyber criminals laundering proceeds derived from a range of criminal activities including computer hacking, ransomware attacks, theft, fraud, corruption and drug crime through BTC-e.

Vinnik was arrested on money-laundering allegations in Greece in 2017 and has since been extradited to France where he remains in custody.

"New Zealand Police has worked closely with the Internal Revenue Service of the United States to address this very serious offending", Coster said. These funds are likely to reflect the profit gained from the victimization of thousands, if not hundreds of thousands, of people globally as a result of cyber-crime and organized crime.
