

1. Consider a matrix equation $A = BC$, Find matrix C , if

$$A = \begin{bmatrix} 1 & 2 & 7 & 4 \\ 5 & 6 & 15 & 8 \\ 9 & 10 & 23 & 12 \end{bmatrix}; \quad B = \begin{bmatrix} 1 & 2 & 3 & 4 \\ 5 & 6 & 7 & 8 \\ 9 & 10 & 11 & 12 \end{bmatrix}$$

2. Find the solution of the problem: 10%

$$y'' - 6y' + 9y = 5e^{3x}; \quad y(0) = 0; y'(0) = 0$$

3. Find the Fourier series of the following periodic functions: 15%

$$f(x) = \sin x; \quad \text{when } 0 \leq x \leq 2\pi \quad \text{and} \quad f(x) = f(x + 2\pi)$$

$$g(x) = \sin x; \quad \text{when } 0 \leq x \leq \pi \quad \text{and} \quad g(x) = g(x + \pi)$$

4. If the general solution of the equation $xy'' + 2(1-x)y' + (x-2)y = 0$ is 15%

$$y(x) = C_1 y_1(x) + C_2 y_2(x), \quad \text{and} \quad y_1(x) = e^x, \quad \text{Find } y_2(x)$$

5. Find the Laurent series of the complex function $f(z) = [z^2 - 3z + 2]^{-1}$ with center $z_0 = 0$, which is valid 15%

in the domain $1 < |z| < 2$

6. Consider one dimensional wave equation 15%

$$\frac{\partial^2 u}{\partial t^2} = c^2 \frac{\partial^2 u}{\partial x^2}, \quad -\infty < x < \infty; t > 0 \quad \text{--- (1)}$$

$$\text{I.C.} \quad \begin{cases} u(x, 0) = f(x) \\ u_t(x, 0) = g(x) \end{cases} \quad -\infty < x < \infty \quad \text{--- (2a, b)}$$

the D' Alembert' s solution is: $u(x, t) = \frac{1}{2}[f(x+ct) + f(x-ct)] + \frac{1}{2c} \int_{x-ct}^{x+ct} g(s) ds$

If the initial conditions $f(x)$ and $g(x)$ are given as:

$$f(x) = \begin{cases} 1 & \text{when } -1 \leq x \leq 1 \\ 0 & \text{otherwise} \end{cases}; \quad g(x) = \begin{cases} 1 & \text{when } -1 \leq x \leq 1 \\ 0 & \text{otherwise} \end{cases}$$

Find $u(x, t)$ at $x = 3$, and $t = 3$, assume $c = 1$

7. Consider the following eigenvalues problem: 15%

$$y'' + \lambda y = 0 \quad a \leq x \leq b \quad \text{--- (1)}$$

$$\text{B.C.} \quad \begin{cases} y(a) = y(b) \\ y'(a) = y'(b) \end{cases} \quad \text{--- (2a, b)}$$

if λ_m and λ_n are two different eigenvalues, show that their corresponding eigenfunctions

$y_m(x)$ and $y_n(x)$ are orthogonal in (a, b) .

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
