Jibo is different. It's not just that he—and I use the term he here, because that's how Jibo refers to himself—looks like something straight out of a Pixar movie, with a big, round head and a face that uses animated icons to convey emotion. It's not just that his body swivels and swerves while he speaks, as if he's talking with his nonexistent hands. It's not just that he can giggle and dance and turn to face you, wherever you are, as soon as you say, "Hey, Jibo."

And while that technology may seem merely amusing—or creepy, depending on your point of view—it could fundamentally reshape how we interact with machines.

In recent years, fall has become virtually synonymous with pumpkin spice, as U.S. grocery stories and cafés tout the flavor in everything from beer and lattes to Oreo cookies. But the trend is even more novel—if not downright impressive—when you consider how Americans once viewed the squash.

Among colonial settlers, pumpkin "was a food of last resort," says Cindy Ott, author of *Pumpkin: The Curious History of an American Icon*. Because the crop was a new-world native, it was seen as primitive. In fact, "pumpkin eater" was a derogatory term for a poor, ignorant farmer. (Hence the nursery rhyme "Peter, Peter, Pumpkin Eater," about a man who can't read or spell.) Things began to change when Americans flocked to cities in the mid-19th century. Nostalgia for farm life meant nostalgia for pumpkins. They were rebranded as a treat, especially after the 1844 publication of Lydia Maria Child's poem "Over the River and Through the Wood," which ends with a cheer for pumpkin pie.

But if nostalgia saved the pumpkin's reputation, the crop returned the favor. In the 20th century, small producers threatened by industrial farms found that roadside pick-your-own pumpkin patches and
